As senior counsel to Alaska Department of Natural Resources Commissioner, Jon advised senior administration officials and state legislators on natural resource issues, including impediments to oil, gas, and mining project development, improvements to state and federal permitting requirements, and strategies to increase investment and job opportunities in Alaska. Jon was also responsible for the agency's administrative appeals and land use planning decisions.

As Alaska-Assistant Attorney General, Oil, Gas and Mining section, Jon

counseled the Attorney General, Governor, and senior state officials on oil and gas lease disputes, permitting natural resource development on federal lands, and pipeline regulatory issues.
