FACULTY

James Brogan is Chair of Cooley's national Intellectual Property practice and partner in the Firm's Litigation department. He is also an adjunct professor at the University of Denver, Sturm College of Law, where he teaches a course on patent litigation. Throughout his 20-plus year legal career, Mr. Brogan has served as lead trial counsel for a diverse collection of technology and life sciences companies such as Innolux Corporation, Gevo, Inc., Hon Hai Precision Industries, Ltd., Picolight, Inc., ACQIS Technology, Inc., and Monolithic Power Systems. In this capacity, Mr. Brogan has successfully represented both plaintiffs and defendants in high-stakes patent trials focusing on key products and technologies. Over the past three years alone, Mr. Brogan scored important jury victories in the Eastern District of Texas, including a win against IBM in which the jury determined that the Fortune 100 company infringed his client's patents relating to blade servers.

James E. Hanft is Director of Intellectual Property for DISH Network L.L.C. His responsibilities include managing all of DISH's patent, trademark and copyright litigations, overseeing the patent and trademark portfolio, acquiring top level domains and supporting new business initiatives. Mr. Hanft spent twenty years in private practice in New York prior to moving to Colorado and joining DISH in 2014.

Lead Administrative Patent Judge Patrick M. Boucher Patent Trial and Appeal Board, Denver

Lead Administrative Patent Judge Patrick M. Boucher was appointed to the Board in 2013 to decide appeals arising from adverse decisions of Examiners at the United States Patent and Trademark Office, and to preside over trials to determine patentability of claims in patents subsequent

to issuance. Judge Boucher has had a fruitful and diverse career of great legal and technical breadth. Prior to his appointment to the Patent Trial and Appeal Board, he practiced as a patent attorney at Pennie & Edmonds LLP in New York, Townsend and Townsend and Crew LLP, and Marsh Fischmann & Breyfogle LLP in Denver. For several years before becoming an attorney, he was an Associate Editor of Physical Review B.

Best Practices Before the U.S. District Court of Colorado



Hon. Magistrate Judge Kristen L. Mix U.S. District Court of Colorado, Denver

Kristen L. Mix was appointed to the federal bench in 2007. In 2012, United States Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts appointed Judge Mix to serve on the Judicial Conference of the United States' Committee on the Administration of the Magistrate Judge System. She

also serves on the United States District Court for the District of Colorado's Local Rules Committee. She is the Tenth Circuit representative to the Federal Magistrate Judges' Association Board of Directors. Judge Mix is a member of the Sedona Conference's Working Group 1. She was the judicial co-founder of the Colorado Intellectual Property American Inn of Court.
