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Identifying Health-Harming Legal Needs

	Legal Area	Sample Social History Questions
1	Income (Income Support, Food Insecurity, Disability Income, Insurance, Medical Debt Forgiveness)	Do you ever have trouble making ends meet? Do you ever have a time when you don't have enough food? Do you have WIC? Food Stamps?
н	Housing (Evictions, Utilities, Poor Conditions, Foreclosures)	Is housing ever a problem for you? Have you noticed signs of infestations or mold? Do you ever have trouble paying the electric or heat bill?
Ε	Education (Special Education, Bullying in Schools, School Enrollment, Access to Education) and Employment	How is your child doing in school? Is he/she getting the help to learn what he/she needs? Is your child in Head Start, Preschool, or other early childhood program? Are you worried about keeping your job? Do you feel intimidated at work?
L	Legal Status (Immigration)	Do you have questions about your immigration status? Do you need help accessing services or benefits for your family?
Ρ	Personal Status (Powers of Attorney, Guardianship, Living Wills) and Protection (Domestic Violence and Abuse, Orders of Protection)	Do you feel like you have control over your medical decisions? Have you ever taken out a restraining order? Do you feel safe in your relationship?

Select Outcomes

- Recognized with the 2015 Outstanding Medical-Legal Partnership Award by the National Center for Medical-Legal Partnership
- Assisted patients and their family members in addressing nearly 3,000 health harming legal issues
- Trained 455 healthcare providers in health justice advocacy
- Contributed equivalent of over \$4 million in attorney's fees
- Over \$560,000 in Medicaid reimbursement
- \$200,000 in Social Security Disability income
- \$60,000 in housing and utility expenses recouped for patient-clients
- 100% success rate in all disability cases with an appealable issue
- Over \$125,000 in outstanding medical debt forgiven in Spring 2015 alone
- Successfully advocated for lead prevention in Chicago's federally assisted housing
